Back to School Reminders:

School Routines

Now is the time to establish goals, determine daily "school" or learning times, and set academic expectations. Taking time to set up a routine and consistently following it in the first few weeks of school can save hours of frustration later.

Grade Level Standards

Prepare your student for grade level expectations and important end-of-the-year tests by incorporating grade level standards in your daily instruction. You can review all of the CA standards on our website. Click on Departments>>Curriculum>>State
Standards. Many of the standards (especially ELA) are meant to be worked on all year to reach Depth of Knowledge (DOK) levels of 3 and 4. For more information about DOK levels, visit Edutopia's Depth of Knowledge Article.

Don't forget the very important Literacy in History/Social Studies, Science, and Technical Subjects Standards. These essentially remind you to practice expository reading and writing across all subjects (even math).

Lastly, remember to incorporate the <u>Standards for Mathematical Practices</u> **Every Day** into your math lessons (for all students grades K-12).

One thing we have done this year is provide **All** CW and CWEB students free access to two (2) programs that can help with grade level standards review throughout the year: MobyMax (for grades K-8) and Education Galaxy (for grades K-6). CV students have free access to Study Island. Your students will have access to their accounts automatically. Encourage your students to use these programs for 15-20 minutes per day in each subject to help them master their grade level content. Welcome back to school!

One of the areas that many parents and students struggle with is writing. It's the area that can, at times, bring tears of frustration as your child sits and stares at the blank piece of paper in front of them. Unfortunately, there are no magic tricks to make writing simple and easy. Writing, like many things, comes back to the simple "practice makes perfect" strategy. That being said, there are some things that you can do to make writing less stressful for your child.

- Write every day. Yes, every day. If it's something that you do every day, then it's nothing to be afraid of.
- Have them write simple things, like the directions for making a sandwich, following every step.
- Have them describe something they see every day, like their room or their favorite toy.
 Then, have them look at what they described and help them pull out the details (all of those lovely adjectives that make writing come alive!). Add those details back into their writing.
- Use My Access. This program is a fabulous self-help tool for your child. Ask your ES for tips to help your child use this amazing tool.

May 19 (Tuesday) - 8th grade promotion **mandatory** practice check in 3:30 p.m. and 8th grade promotion at 7:00 p.m.

May 21 (Thursday) - Senior graduation **mandatory** practice check in 3:30 p.m. and senior graduation at 7:00 p.m.

If you do not submit your participation form by the deadline date, your student will not be

able to participate in the ceremony, and honorees and acknowledgements will not appear on the program. Deadlines are final, and there are no exceptions due to the necessary preplanning for this event.
